

Women to Women Mentoring Agreement

We agree to:

- Put God first and ask Him to bless and keep our relationship Christcentered, on-going, fulfilling,
- Create a safe environment where we can be heard and feel loved so we will be careful with being judgmental, giving quick answers, and offering our simple fixes to complex situations. Be confidential keeping anything that is shared strictly between the mentoring pair.
- Be mindful and respectful giving priority to the agreed upon mentor/ mentee meetings, doing things together such as Bible studies, taking walks, going out for a meal or coffee, spending time in each other's home, or attending church functions (retreats, seminars, or women's activities).
- Give priority to other scheduled Mentoring gatherings. (mentor Halftime Refresher / Celebration Coffee)
- Make a nine-month commitment to the Mentor/Mentee relationship.
- Communicate regularly.
- To pray for each other and ask the Lord to deepen our bond of friendship.
- Call the Mentoring Ministry Coach, or someone on the Admin Team, if you are having problems or have questions about your mentoring relationship.

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



Sara Laird - Communications Coordinator
