Información de contexto

- El tema del libro de Ezequiel es conocer a Dios: 68 veces Dios dice a través de Ezequiel “sabrán que yo soy el Señor”.
- Conocemos a Dios a través de un encuentro con Él (Ez. 1-3), a través de las consecuencias de nuestra desobediencia (Ez. 4-32), y a través de la restauración y salvación (Ez. 33-48).
- El pueblo judío está en el exilio en Babilonia (Irak) debido a su repetida desobediencia al Señor (2 Reyes 24). El año es 593 a.C. Ezequiel es un sacerdote de 30 años exiliado en Babilonia.
- Mientras está en Babilonia, Ezequiel tiene un encuentro con la Presencia de Dios que cambia su vida y le da dirección a su ministerio de vida (1: 1,28).

¿Qué es un llamado?

- Diccionario Webster - llamado: Un fuerte impulso interior hacia un curso de acción en particular, especialmente cuando va acompañado de la convicción de la influencia divina.

- Angie Ward: "Llamado es una convicción dada por Dios sobre la dirección de tu vida".
- Ezequiel 1-3 es una descripción del llamado de Ezequiel.

Seis aspectos de su llamamiento (Ezequiel 2-3)

1. _____ - El llamado proviene de escuchar la voz de Dios (1: 28-2: 5)
 - El término "llamando" significa literalmente que Alguien te está llamando (hablándote). Escuchar un llamado requiere escuchar.
 - El llamado de Ezequiel fue muy dramático (una visión del trono-carro volador de la gloria de Dios seguida por la voz audible de Dios). La mayoría de las historias de llamadas de la gente no son tan dramáticas.
 - Siete maneras en que Dios habla a su pueblo en los tiempos del Nuevo Testamento:
 - 1) A través de las Escrituras (2 Timoteo 3: 16-17; Hechos 1:20; 2: 17-21)
 - 2) A través de impresiones (Hechos 8:29)
 - 3) A través de las circunstancias (Hechos 5: 1-11; 10: 44-48; 16: 6-7)
 - 4) A través de las personas (Hechos 9: 26-28; 11: 27-30; 13: 1-3; 18: 24-27; 21: 10-11; 2 Samuel 12)
 - 5) A través de ángeles (Hechos 5: 19-20; 8:26; 12: 5-11; 27: 23-24)
 - 6) A través de una voz audible (Hechos 9: 1-9; 23:11)
 - 7) A través de sueños y visiones (Hechos 2: 17-21; 9: 10,12; 10: 3-19; 16: 9-10; 18: 9)
 - Salmo 46:10 - Quédense quietos y reconozcan que yo soy Dios.
 - Os Guinness: "En primer lugar, estamos llamados a Alguien (Dios), no a algo (como la maternidad, la política o la enseñanza) o a algún lugar (como el centro de la ciudad o Mongolia exterior)".
 - Aplicación # 1 - Como estilo de vida, buscaré con regularidad estar quieto ante el Señor, buscarlo ante todo y escuchar Su dirección para mi vida. Leeré Su Palabra regularmente con un oído atento, y también buscaré escuchar al Señor a través de otras personas, circunstancias, impresiones y visiones (pero siempre confirmadas por la Palabra de Dios).
2. _____ - Debemos elegir no tener miedo de seguir nuestro llamado (2: 6-7; 3: 9)
 - Cuatro veces se le dice a Ezequiel que "no temas" (2: 6.6.6; 3: 9)
 - El resto del libro de Ezequiel contiene muchos mensajes muy difíciles para que Ezequiel los entregue al pueblo judío exiliado.

Ezequiel necesitará recordar repetidamente su llamado y ser valiente (sin miedo) para cumplir con su llamado.

- Rick Warren: "Es interesante notar que hay 365 versículos en la Biblia que dicen, 'No temas'. ¡Dios nos proporcionó un mensaje de 'No temas' para todos los días del año!"
- Marcos 5:36 (LB) - No tengas miedo. Solo confía en mí.
- Aplicación # 2 - ¿Qué aspectos de mi llamado me tientan a tener miedo y no cumplir con mi llamado? Hoy, elijo confiar en Dios con esos temores y marchar hacia adelante en fe y obediencia de todos modos.

3. _____ - Todos estamos llamados a compartir la Palabra de Dios con los demás. Al hacerlo, debemos asegurarnos de recibir, digerir y obedecer la Palabra de Dios por nosotros mismos primero (2: 8-3: 3,10)

- Jeremías 15:16 - Fueron encontradas tus palabras, y las comí, y tus palabras se convirtieron para mí en un gozo y el deleite de mi corazón.
- El apóstol Juan tuvo una experiencia similar en Apocalipsis 10: 8-11.
- John Owens: "Nadie predica bien su sermón a otros si no lo predica primero a su propio corazón".
- Aplicación # 3 - ¿Cuál es mi plan para internalizar la Palabra de Dios?

4. _____ - El hecho de que Dios nos llame a algo no significa que vaya a ser fácil, cómodo y sin dificultades. Dios nos llama a ser firmes en nuestro llamado sin importar las dificultades (3: 4-15)

- La tarea de Ezequiel fue muy, muy difícil. Dios estaba llamando a Ezequiel a ser tan obstinado en la entrega del mensaje de Dios como la gente fue obstinada en desobedecerlo.
- Gálatas 6: 9 - No nos cansemos de hacer el bien, porque a su tiempo segaremos, si no nos damos por vencidos.
- Aplicación # 4 - ¡Con la ayuda y el poder de Dios, perseveraré en ser firme en el llamado de Dios en mi vida sin importar las dificultades o rechazos!

5. _____ - Dios nos ha llamado a todos a ser atalayas en nuestros muros (3: 16-21)

- Los vigilantes eran guardias responsables de proteger a las ciudades de los ataques enemigos por sorpresa y otros peligros potenciales. Las antiguas ciudades israelitas a menudo colocaban vigilantes en muros altos o en torres de vigilancia. Su trabajo consistía en vigilar y advertir a la gente del pueblo de las amenazas inminentes.
- Aplicación # 5a - Somos responsables de las personas que viven dentro de nuestros muros (nuestra esfera de influencia ... como nuestra familia, vecinos, compañeros de trabajo, compañeros de escuela, comunidad). Hay peligro acechando fuera de los muros, y tenemos que hacer sonar la alarma.
 - El peligro de la eternidad separado de Dios en el infierno.
 - El peligro de una cultura mundana que nos atrae a nosotros ya nuestros hijos lejos del Señor.
- Aplicación # 5b: el 10 de octubre, agregaremos dos nuevos grupos de personas a nuestra esfera de influencia (dentro de nuestros muros) mediante la adopción formal de los pueblos azeri y afar:

Tres cosas para prepararse para esa semana:

 1. Ore antes de firmar la declaración con otros miembros y asistentes regulares de su iglesia.
 2. Vaya a <https://www.whatisgrace.org/missions> y lea sobre los Afar y Azeri para que esté haciendo una adopción informada.
 3. Asegúrese de sumergirse en toda la experiencia (sonidos, sabores, vistas en un recorrido experiencial después de cada servicio).

6. _____ -

Algunas veces Dios nos dará una parábola o palabra profética asociada con nuestro llamado (3: 22-27)

- Uno de los juicios de Dios sobre una nación es la falta de un profeta o la falta de una Palabra del Señor. Por ejemplo, los 400 años de silencio (también conocido como Período Intertestamental) fue parte del juicio de Dios. La atadura y el mutismo de Ezequiel (3: 25-28) es una imagen profética del silencio crítico.
- Aplicación # 6: ¿Le ha dado Dios una imagen asociada con su llamado a la que puede aferrarse cuando los tiempos se ponen difíciles?

Background Information

- The theme of the book of Ezekiel is knowing God: 68 times God says through Ezekiel “they shall know that I am the Lord.”
- We know God through encounters with Him (Chap 1-3), through consequences for our disobedience (Chap 4-32), and through restoration and salvation (Chap 33-48).
- The Jewish people are in exile in Babylon (modern day Iraq) because of their repeated disobedience to the Lord (2 Kings 24). The Year is 593 B.C. Ezekiel is a 30-year-old priest in exile in Babylon.
- While in Babylon, Ezekiel has an encounter with the Presence of God that changes his life and gives direction to his life ministry (1:1,28).

What is a Calling?

- Webster’s Dictionary – calling (*n.*): a strong inner impulse toward a particular course of action especially when accompanied by conviction of divine influence.
- Angie Ward: “Calling is a God-given conviction about your life’s direction.”
- Ezekiel 1-3 is a description of Ezekiel’s calling.

Six Aspects of Your Calling (Ezekiel 2-3)

1. _____ – Calling comes from hearing the voice of God (1:28-2:5)

- The term “calling” literally means that Someone is calling to you (speaking to you). Hearing a calling requires listening.
- Ezekiel’s calling was very dramatic (a vision of the flying throne-chariot of God’s glory followed by the audible voice of God). Most people’s calling stories are not that dramatic.
- Seven Ways God Speaks to His People in New Testament Times:
 - (1) Through Scripture (2 Timothy 3:16-17; Acts 1:20; 2:17-21)
 - (2) Through promptings (Acts 8:29)
 - (3) Through circumstances (Acts 5:1-11; 10:44-48; 16:6-7)
 - (4) Through people (Acts 9:26-28; 11:27-30; 13:1-3; 18:24-27; 21:10-11; 2 Samuel 12)
 - (5) Through angels (Acts 5:19-20; 8:26; 12:5-11; 27:23-24)
 - (6) Through an audible voice (Acts 9:1-9; 23:11)
 - (7) Through dreams and visions (Acts 2:17-21; 9:10,12; 10:3-19; 16:9-10; 18:9)
- **Psalm 46:10** – *Be still and know that I am God.*
- Os Guinness: “First and foremost we are called to Someone (God), not to something (such as motherhood, politics, or teaching) or to somewhere (such as the inner city or Outer Mongolia).”
- Application #1 – As a lifestyle, I will regularly seek to be still before the Lord, seek Him first and foremost, and listen for His direction for my life. I will read His Word regularly with a listening ear, and I will also seek to hear the Lord through other people, circumstances, promptings, and visions (but always confirmed by God’s Word).

2. _____ – We must choose to not be afraid to pursue our calling (2:6-7; 3:9)

- Four times Ezekiel is told to “fear not” (2:6.6.6; 3:9)
- The rest of the book of Ezekiel contains a lot of very difficult messages for Ezekiel to deliver to the exiled Jewish people. Ezekiel will need to repeatedly remember his calling and be brave (not afraid) in order to fulfill his calling.
- Rick Warren: “It’s interesting to note that there are 365 verses in the Bible that say, ‘Fear not.’ God provided us with one ‘Fear not’ message for every day of the year!”
- **Mark 5:36** (LB) – *Don’t be afraid. Just trust Me.*
- Application #2 – What aspects of my calling tempt me to be afraid and to not fulfill my calling? Today, I choose to trust God with those fears and to march forward in faith and obedience anyway.

3. _____ – **We are all called to share God’s Word with others. As we do so, we must be sure to receive and digest and obey God’s Word for ourselves first (2:8-3:3,10)**
- **Jeremiah 15:16** – *Your words were found, and I ate them, and Your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart.*
 - The Apostle John had a similar experience in Revelation 10:8-11
 - John Owens: “No one preaches his sermon well to others if he does not first preach it to his own heart.”
 - **Application #3** – What is my plan for internalizing the Word of God?
 - Engaging a Bible reading plan (Quiet Time Journal)
 - Memorizing Scripture
 - navigators.org/resource/topical-memory-system
 - Obeying God’s Word
 - Sharing God’s Word with others.
4. _____ – **Just because God calls us to something doesn’t mean that it’s going to be easy and smooth and without difficulties. God calls us to be steadfast in our calling regardless of the difficulties (3:4-15)**
- Ezekiel’s assignment was very, very difficult. God was calling Ezekiel to be as stubborn in delivering God’s message as the people were stubborn in disobeying it.
 - **Galatians 6:9** – *Let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up.*
 - **Application #4** – With God’s help and power, I will persevere in being steadfast to God’s calling on my life regardless of difficulties or rejections!
5. _____ – **God has called all of us to be watchmen on our walls (3:16-21)**
- Watchmen were guards responsible for protecting towns from surprise enemy attacks and other potential dangers. Ancient Israelite cities often stationed watchmen on high walls or in watchtowers. Their job was to keep watch and warn the townspeople of impending threats.
 - **Application #5a** – We are responsible for the people who live within our walls (our sphere of influence... like our family, neighbors, coworkers, school mates, community). There is danger lurking outside the walls, and we need to sound the alarm.
 - The danger of eternity separated from God in Hell.
 - The danger of a worldly culture luring us and our children away from the Lord.

- Application #5b – On October 10th, We will add two new people groups to our sphere of influence (within our walls) by formally adopting the Azeri and the Afar peoples:

We the people of Grace Fellowship Church adopt the Afar of Ethiopia and the Azeri of Azerbaijan, and we commit to pray and give and go and learn and serve so that they might hear the Good News of Jesus Christ and become co-heirs with us of God's Kingdom.

Three things to prepare for next week:

1. Pray about signing the above statement next Sunday with other members and regular attenders of your church.
2. Go online to Grace Fellowship's website and read up on the Afar and Azeri so that you are making an informed adoption. Info at WhatIsGrace.org/Missions
3. Be sure to dive into the entire experience next Sunday (sounds, tastes, sights in an experiential tour after each service). If you have kids, grab them after the service and come back and take them through the experiential tour.

6. _____ – **Sometimes God will give us a parable or prophetic word associated with our calling (3:22-27)**

- One of God's judgments on a nation is the lack of a prophet or the lack of a Word from the Lord. For example, the 400 years of silence (also known as the Intertestamental Period) was part of God's judgment. The binding and muteness of Ezekiel (3:25-28) is a prophetic picture of judgmental silence.
- Application #6 – Has God given you a picture associated with your calling that you can cling to when times get difficult?
